Milo's Obituary

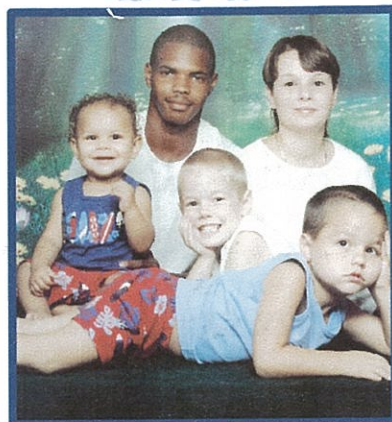

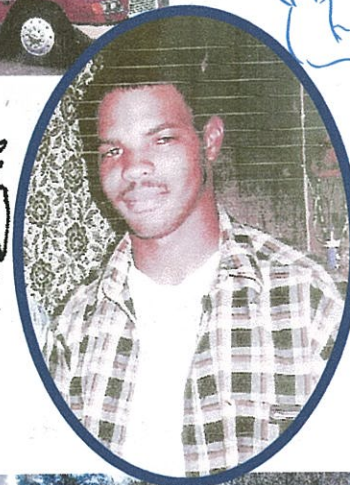
