 No need for you to grieve

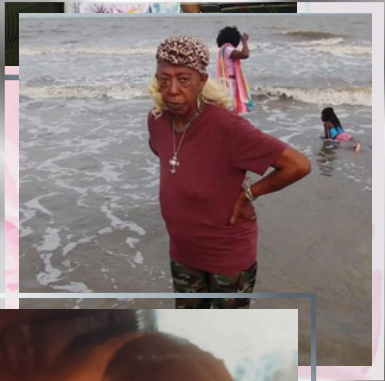
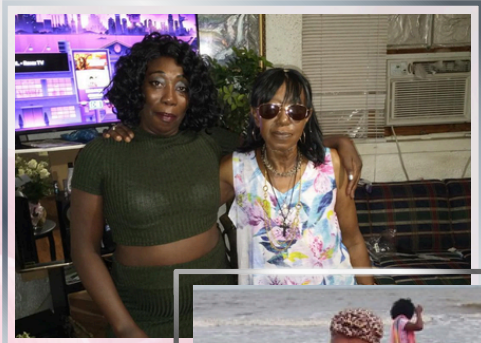
The beauty that's surrounding me
